MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER

As I look back on 2024, I feel proud to reflect on our journey at the Cauvery Wildlife Sanctuary and the impactful work carried out through Vanodaya.



Since inception, Vanodaya continued its commitment to conservation through a range of initiatives including the Eco Club Program, nurturing environmental awareness among children in forest-bordering schools. Local volunteers led ground patrols to safeguard forest peripheries, while crowd management teams ensured peaceful, incident-free Jathres. Seasonal fire prevention campaigns raised awareness during dry months, and ongoing stakeholder engagement was fostered through checkpoint duties, film screenings, watcher programs, crisis response efforts, and training sessions.

Overall, it has been a deeply fulfilling journey that has strengthened our bond with the forest, with every Vanodaya member becoming, in spirit, a child of the Cauvery Wildlife Sanctuary.

For the past decade, these flagship projects have reflected our core mission of community-led conservation and sustainable coexistence with nature. Each initiative has been thoughtfully designed to address critical challenges around the Cauvery Wildlife Sanctuary, while fostering awareness, community participation, and lasting impact.

Project	When/What	Outcome
Eco Club	June 2024 to Feb 2025 Conducted awareness sessions and engagement activities for local communities and students.	Strengthened conservation awareness and local engagement through education.
Jaathre	Chikkaluru: Jan 16-17th; Shivarathri: Feb 26 Assisted in crowd management, traffic control, alcohol checks, and tourist education to ensure responsible behavior and wildlife safety.	Prevented unauthorized activities, regulated vehicles, and reduced fire risks during festivals, minimizing impact on protected areas.
Forest Fire Awareness Program	Jan 3rd -4th 2025 Forest fire awareness program conducted in 25 schools over two days	Engaged schools around CWLS to raise student awareness on forests and the impact of forest fires.

Project	When/What	Outcome
Patrolling	45 Days over the year Monitored and managed tourist activity, guided visitors safely, and reduced risks to wildlife.	Ensured controlled tourism, minimized littering, and prevented unauthorized access to sensitive areas.
Watcher welfare	Over the financial year Mobilised the Emergency Response Team to raise funds for medical emergencies for Forest Department staff	Raised INR 34K to provide medical support for forest department
Manning Checkposts	40 Days over the year Checked vehicles for alcohol, educated visitors, and distributed safety pamphlets.	Promoted responsible visitor behavior, reduced wildlife disturbances, and enhanced forest protection





WAY-AHEAD.....



As we look ahead to coming year, we plan to continue to focus on the following areas

Community engagement - we plan to build on the expansion of our Eco Club program over the last few years, with the aim of making it self sufficient in established schools, which allows us to expand to new schools. One area we plan to explore further is understanding and addressing conflict between people and wildlife. This is something we had started earlier, but were not able to pursue effectively. Our awareness activities with the community on forest fire prevention and the need for wildlife conservation will continue.

Government engagement - we plan to continue to work closely with the forest department to prevent forest fires, add additional support during key festivals where many people pass through the forest, provide financial support to watchers that are injured in the line of duty and ongoing patrolling on public roads.

In addition to these two areas, we plan to add to the understanding of key species (for example, the Grizzled Giant Squirrel) in this landscape through scientific study, and explore opportunities to collaborate with like minded organizations that are also focused on this and the broader landscape.

All of these will be grounded in our stated purpose, values and beliefs as an organization.
